- US college drop-out rate is 40%. SGSNY scholars completion rate is 98%.
- SGSNY scholars are first or second generation immigrants. Majority are first-generation college students.
- SGSNY scholars are majority immigrant or first-generation American with Commonwealth links and many are the first-generation college students.
- 74% are female and 98% are Black or people of color.
- SGSNY supports City University of New York (CUNY) students across all five NYC boroughs, and is one of the largest donors to Lehman College.



In the United States, the overall dropout rate for undergraduate college students is 40%.*

These students—largely low-income, first-generation and students of color—are forced to delay or discontinue their academic pursuits due to the increasingly prohibitive cost of college. They are often responsible for supporting their families and despite their best efforts, balancing school, family and work is a major challenge.

At St. George’s Society of New York (SGSNY), our goal is to continue our 254 years of “serving the underserved” and close the education and opportunity gap for these students and help them unleash their potential.

We know that higher education serves as an engine for social and economic mobility. By removing financial barriers, we can ensure that these high-achieving students can focus on their studies, reach graduation and take the next step towards achieving their professional goals.

SGSNY'S SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Since 2008, St. George's Society of New York's Scholarship Program has provided valuable financial aid to remarkable students in their final year of undergraduate studies. Intervention at this critical moment has a monumental impact and helps our students across the finish line.

We have served nearly 500 scholars—first at Lehman and Hunter Colleges, and now at City University of New York (CUNY) institutions across all five boroughs of New York City.

With a completion rate of 98%, these extraordinary individuals have gone on to pursue careers in a variety of fields including medicine, education, social work, finance, and tech.

Many of our scholars remain closely tied to their communities, giving back in their own ways.

Our assistance goes far beyond graduation—including invaluable enrichment opportunities such as mentoring and career development workshops, which help to bridge the divide between college and employment.

Samuel, 2021 Scholar

Samuel was born & raised in Kumasi, Ghana, before emigrating to the US. He gained a place at Lehman College to pursue a Nursing degree, but the pandemic posed many challenges for him. Quarantine rules made school/life balance difficult, and he was unable to work, which created significant financial hardship. The SGSNY scholarship helped Samuel to pay for his textbooks and school supplies, clinical virtual simulation programs, equipment, transportation and living expenses.

He plans to enroll in a Nurse Anesthetist Program, after working 1-2 years in critical care areas.

"The scholarship eliminated the need for me to find work and instead allowed me to focus more on my studies. SGSNY has also provided me with guidance through mentorships and helped me to build my network through meeting other scholarship recipients and people in different fields of work."

Popy, 2022 Scholar

Originally from Bangladesh, Popy lost her mother at the age of nine and was prevented from completing her education. She immigrated to the U.S. in 2015 and completed a GED, teaching herself English at the Queens Library and with YouTube classes. Popy realized her educational goals in 2023 when she graduated from Queens College with a Fine Arts degree.

In the fall after graduation, she was accepted into John's Hopkins University's Master of Nonprofit Management program. She aspires to give voice to South Asian women in the U.S. and globally.
